

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Teacher's notes


#### Preparation

Copy one set for each student. Either cut the dialogue cards apart, or bring enough pairs of scissors for the students to cut them apart.

#### In class

You can do this activity individually or as pair work. Hand out a set to every student or one set per pair. Have students read the job advertisement and fill in Tom's email. Students should then cut out the dialogue cards and put them in the correct order. They read the conversation out in pairs for you to check. Then they talk about whether they would like to be a tour guide and report back to the whole group.
