Packing for a camping trip**Teacher's notes***Preparation:*

Copy one sheet for each student.

In class:

Ask students to imagine they are packing for a camping trip. First students decide individually which ten things from the list they would pack. Then they compare and discuss their lists in pairs, each partner giving reasons for the things they chose. Then the pairs decide which ten things they would pack. Each pair then gets together with another pair, compares and discusses the lists and decides on a list of ten things. This can be continued until one list is made for the whole class. A student can write the class list on the board.

Alternatively, the groups can compare and explain their lists to the whole class.
