Hotel Golden Sunset, Phuket, Thailand

- Bungalows directly on the beach
- Free windsurfing and tennis
- Free Thai cookery lessons
- Includes a jungle trekking trip with elephants
- Near town centre
- Spa next door
- Breakfast included
- Beach bungalow €629 per person, per week

Tell the class which hotel you chose and why. Which hotel got the most votes?

Role-play: work with a partner. One of you is the hotel receptionist, the other one makes a reservation. Then choose a different hotel and change roles.

Which hotel would you like to go to? Which one is the most attractive place for the class?



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Teacher's notes

Preparation:

Make one copy of the sheet for each student as a handout after the activity. Make one copy for each group of 3 - 4 students and cut up the different parts along the lines.

In class:

- 1. Form groups of 3 or 4.
- 2. Lead in by writing *Honeymoon Hotel* on the board and elicit the meaning. Ask students if anyone went on a honeymoon or know someone who did.
- 3. Tell your class they are going to choose the perfect hotel for a young couple's honeymoon trip.
- 4. Give a set of cut up texts and the photograph of Nick and Jackie to each group and ask them to choose a hotel for them. The hotel descriptions are deliberately ambiguous to trigger discussions. Give students time and walk around and help, if necessary.
- 5. Students report back to the class and give reasons for their choice.
- 6. In pairs students role-play booking the hotel. One partner is the hotel receptionist, and the other calls to make a reservation for Nick and Jackie. Give students a few minutes to prepare their roles. Walk around and help if necessary.
- 7. Round off the activity by discussing with the whole class which hotel the students would like to go to.
- 8. Hand out a copy of the worksheet to each student.

→ Extension activity

Tell students that the receptionist forgot the reservations and ask them to write an email to make sure they can stay at their favourite hotel.
