That was a great party you organized last week! What was the name of the band?	I really like your earrings*! Did you bring them back from India? *earrings - Ohrringe
This pen is great! Where did you get it?	What a beautiful coat! It's a lovely colour. Was it expensive?
What a fantastic car! Is it new?	Your handbag* looks great! How much did it cost? *handbag - Handtasche
The seafood* salad at your party was delicious! Can I have the recipe? *seafood - Meeresfrüchte	This wine is excellent! Where did you get it?



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Teacher's notes

Preparation:

Make one copy of sheets 1 and 2 and cut up the cards along the lines.

In class:

The aim of this activity is to practise paying compliments to each other as a conversation starter. Give each student one card. Make sure students understand they should use their imagination. Practise the intonation with some students beforehand. Pre-teach possible reactions to the compliments and list them on the board.

Act out an example, i.e. one student reads out his/her card and pays you a compliment. React appropriately. Make sure the atmosphere is relaxed.

Students then get up and mingle, find themselves a partner and take turns in paying each other the compliment they have on their cards. After a short conversation, they exchange cards and find a new partner, repeating the procedure. Walk around and help, or participate in the activity. Finish off by asking: "What was the nicest compliment you got?"

Extension activity: Students can, of course, use their own – realistic – examples and pay each other compliments.
