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Teacher's notes

**Preparation:**

Copy one worksheet for every learner in the class.

**In class:**

Tell your class that this is a love story. The sentence beginnings on the left side of the page are in the right order. But the sentence endings on the right have become tangled. The learners must try to match sentence beginnings and endings. (They can do so by numbering the correct sentence endings from 1–12 to correspond with the sentence beginnings. Or you can cut out the twelve boxes with the sentence endings and ask your participants to move the slips of paper around as they decide where they belong. This is a good method for visual and kinesthetic learners.) Check the texts with the whole class.

Then, if you like, ask your learners to underline the verbs and give you the infinitive forms.

You can also see if they know why the last two sentences are in the present tense.

Time needed:
